JUDGING LISTS – INLINE WITH KC POLICIES and RECOMENDATIONS – MAY 2024

A" 1 List - BREED SPECIALISTS & NON-BREED SPECIALISTS

Criteria

For people who have previously been approved by the Kennel Club to award CCs in the breed, have completed their first appointment and have the support of the West of England Border Collie Club.

"A" 2 List - BREED SPECIALISTS & NON-BREED SPECIALISTS

Criteria

For people who fulfil all the requirements for the A3 list, who have been assessed in accordance with Kennel Club requirements and accepted by the Kennel Club for inclusion on an A2 list, and have the support of the West of England Border Collie Club

"A" 3 List - BREED SPECIALISTS

Criteria

- A Minimum of seven years judging experience in the breed and have the support of the West of England Border Collie Club (KC Policy)
- B To have judged at least 1 Breed Club Show
- C To have judged the breed at 7 Open Shows or Championship Shows without CCs with an adequate geographical spread
- D To have judged a minimum of 40 breed classes at Open or Championship Shows
- E To have judged a minimum of 120 dogs in the breed
- F To have attended a seminar given by a Kennel Club Accredited Trainer and passed the relevant examination on Kennel Club Regulations and Judging Procedures. (KC Policy as of 1.7.2001)
- G To have attended a seminar given by a Kennel Club Accredited Trainer on Conformation and Movement. (KC Policy as of 1.7.2001)
- H To have attended a Points of the Dog Assessment conducted by a Kennel Club Accredited Trainer and passed the assessment. (KC Policy as of 1.7.2005)
- I To have attended at least one Breed Specific Seminar run in accordance with the relevant Kennel Club Code of Best Practice and passed an examination and/or assessment where applicable. (KC Policy as of 1.7.2001)
- J To have bred and/or owned a minimum of three dogs when they obtained their first entry in the Kennel Club Stud Book (save in exceptional circumstances). (KC Policy)
- K To have stewarded at 12 Shows. (KC Policy)
- l Must state that they are prepared to write show critiques as customarily requested by the weekly dog press and to forward a copy to the Secretary for inclusion on our website

"A" 3 List - NON-BREED SPECIALISTS

Criteria

- 7 years proven involvement in pedigree dogs
- Owned or bred 3 dogs in the stud book (first breed only)
- Attended the Requirements of a Dog Show judge seminar and passed the exam
- Passed Points of the Dog Assessment
- Attended Conformation and Movement Seminar
- Stewarded for a minimum of 12 full days
- Attended a Breed specific seminar (essential for first 3 breeds, optional but recommended for all subsequent breeds)
- Attended and passed a hands-on assessment for the breed run in accordance with the KC code of best practice (essential for the first 3 breeds, optional for all subsequent breeds)
- Judged the required number of dogs for the breed (120 dogs) with a good geographical spread.
